Information Literacy

Information Literacy is the ability to identify what information is needed, to understand how the information is organized, to identify the best sources of information for a given need, to locate those sources, to evaluate the sources critically, and to share that information. It is the knowledge of commonly used research techniques. Information literacy is critically important because we are surrounded by a growing ocean of information in all

formats. Not all information is created equal: some is authoritative, current and reliable, but some is biased, out of date, misleading, and false.
